Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

I receive many appeals in the mail to separate St. Joseph Church from money. The one that makes me laugh the most is the proposal to have a company increase our collections by consulting with them. Of course, they charge a hefty sum to do this consultation.

I received a good appeal last week. I hope that it will have a very positive impact upon our parish. We continue to participate in the Eucharistic Revival through this year. Bishop Robert Barron and the Word on Fire organization published a book to help American Catholics better understand the mystery of the Eucharist that we celebrate. The book is: This Is My Body, A Call to Eucharistic Revival. The

cost was inexpensive so I think this offer was a good value for the money we spent.

Bishop Robert Barron is the bishop of Winona-Rochester, Minnesota. He is a renowned teacher, preacher, and evangelist. He is a very popular Catholic speaker and writer. He founded Word on Fire as the vehicle to evangelize the Church in our time. A number of our parishioners subscribe to receive his work online or through the mail.

I find him somewhat tedious. When I listen to his talks or read his work I am usually frustrated because it takes him some time (forever) to get to his main point or conclusion. While I want him to get on his horse and gallop, other people enjoy the long journey he takes to get them to his conclusion. I respect the point that not everyone wants him to go fast.

So I ordered the book, *This Is My Body*, for distribution at St. Joseph Parish. I anticipate that the book will have arrived by the time you read this bulletin. If so, they will be in the vestibule of the church available for your reading. If not,

I expect that it will arrive soon. It is not a big book, just over 100 pages of large print on small pages. I hope that it will engage your mind and spirit with the mystery of the Eucharist and help you reflect on what we do each weekend at mass.

I hope that you will enjoy it.



How Old Does a Child Need to Be in Order to Stay Alone?

Don't assume that when your child understands what you're saying, he's ready to walk out the door by himself. Besides the fact that many states have laws against leaving children of certain ages alone (for example, younger than 12), experts say children shouldn't be left by themselves until they're capable of fighting off an abductor or handling a crisis situation. Experts also say children do not have the mental maturity to cross busy streets by themselves until they're about 10 or 12 years old. (Did you know that pedestrian injuries rank third in child fatalities, behind traffic accidents and drowning?) Finally, parents who are certain their young children would never walk away with a stranger will be shocked to learn that studies show they probably will. Stay alert and vigilant, even if you believe your child is aware of possible dangers from others.



If you currently volunteer in any capacity with children, the elderly, etc., or plan to in the future, through parish groups such as religious education, Knights of Columbus, parish events, and have not completed a safe environment training. contact the religious education office at 508-832-6683 to make arrangements.

We offer an in-person training at the parish center on Monday, September 11, 6:30pm. We also offer an online tutorial for you through the diocese of Worcester. If you have completed the training in the past, you only need to submit a new CORI application with a copy of your license.

We cannot have any volunteers working with our children who have not completed this training.

Participants taking the online class also need to complete a CORI form and submit a copy of their license, which is also provided from the religious ed office.
