



Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

A few times each year the Church reminds us that we have a responsibility to spread the faith in the missions. We welcomed a mission priest to our parish in the summer months. He delivered the homily at all the masses. We took up a collection and we forwarded the money to support the missions.

Next week we will continue our support of the missions on World Mission Sunday. Bishop McManus wrote a letter about Mission Sunday and it is printed in this bulletin. More people were sensitive to the work of the missions a



generation ago. Much work was directed toward the African Church that was in its infancy. Now, a generation later, the African Church is much stronger.

A generation ago there were many European and American missionaries who worked in Africa. Then, a priest like Father Donald Pelletier who grew up in the Diocese of Worcester and was part of the LaSalette order, went to Madagascar to preach, teach, and provide the sacraments. He eventually became a bishop there.

Bishop Pelletier retired about ten years ago, returned to the United States, and died in a vehicle accident a couple of years ago. He always spoke lovingly of the Church in Madagascar where he spent much of his time as a priest.

The Church in Africa still faces challenges. It faces persecution in some regions. Overall, it prospers and grows in the Holy Spirit.

One great stride that the African Church has made is the ordination of native men to the priesthood. This parish benefitted from the missions in Africa when Father Patrick was assigned here.

The primary support that we can provide to the missions is prayer. Just about every missionary that I meet tells me that the missions find their strength in the prayers offered to God seeking intercession for the cause of the missions. They usually find grace because someone like us has asked God for a blessing on the Mission Church.

Missionaries are very grateful for the financial support that we give them. Our donations provide essential goods that see to the needs of people in the missions. Every missionary knows that it is difficult to proclaim the Gospel to people who need the basic necessities of life. When the Gospel comes with clean water wells, medicine, agricultural support, education, and peaceful community, the words of Jesus ring true.

Our parish will participate in World Mission Sunday next weekend. Please be generous.

A Message from Bishop McManus ...

My dear friends in Christ,

In his message for World Mission Day 2023, Pope Francis shared the following: "Like the Apostles and the first Christians, we too can say with complete conviction: 'We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard' (Acts 4:20). Everything we have received from the Lord is meant to be put to good use and freely shared with others."

The Holy Father goes on to share that the same Spirit who guides the universal Church also inspires ordinary men and women for extraordinary missions. He writes, "we recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel. Let us remember especially all those who resolutely set out, leaving home and family behind, to bring the Gospel to



all those places and people athirst for its saving message. To be on mission is to be willing to think as Christ does, to believe with Him that those around us are also my brothers and sisters. May His compassionate love touch our hearts and make us all true missionary disciples."

Your donation on the weekend of October 22nd is critical. The Pontifical Mission Societies serve the Church's universality as a global network of support for the Pope in his missionary commitment by prayer, the soul of mission, and charitable of ferings from Christians throughout the world. These donations assist the Pope in the evangelization efforts of particular Churches (the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith), in the formation of local clergy (the Pontifical Society of Saint Peter the Apostle), and in raising missionary awareness in children (Pontifical Society of Missionary Childhood).

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism. It also provides an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in nearly 1,200 mission dioceses. Thank you for prayerfully reflecting on your own baptismal call, and support World Mission Sunday in your parish.

Tenth Annual Celebrate Priesthood -Taste of the Diocese Gala


