Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

This week the Church celebrates All Saints Day on November 1 and All Souls Day on November 2. Both celebrations direct our attention to eternal life in God's presence. The celebrations give us pause

to contemplate God's plan of salvation.



All Saints Day, November 1, celebrates all the saints. Liturgists find its origin in the fourth century in a commemoration of all the martyrs. The date was May 13. The early Church placed high honor to the people who suffered or died because they professed their faith in Jesus, the Son of God. The Church later began to rejoice in the men and women who lived according to the Gospel in heroic ways, such as doing works of charity only for the love of God. Pious men

and women gained notoriety because of their devotion to God and diligently spreading the Word of God so God would be known and glorified by many.

The Church's liturgical calendar became full with many celebrations of holy people, so much so that some days celebrated a myriad of saints. All Saints Day became the practical way to remember holy men and women who embodied the Gospel and, with God's grace, enjoy eternal life in heaven. The celebration was moved to November in the ninth century and remains so until today.

All Saints Day is a holyday of obligation that Catholics observe in prayer at mass. I will celebrate All Saints Day on Tuesday evening at 6:30 and on Wednesday at 8:00 a.m. and noon.

All Souls Day is a celebration of prayer for remembering people who have died. Catholics pray for people who have died that God will raise them from the dead as he raised his Son on Easter and

welcome them to eternal life in God's heavenly kingdom. We ask God to forgive their sins with his mercy. We entrust them to God's loving care.

Many Catholics visit cemeteries on All Souls Day and spend time at the graves of loved ones in prayer.

Parishioners write the names of loved ones on the donation envelope and place it in the basket. I celebrate masses throughout the year for these All

Souls Day intentions, remembering them on All Souls Day and many other days as well.

May our friends and relatives rest in God's care and peace. May they rejoice as part of the All Saints Day celebration as well.


