



Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

There is a banner that has been hanging from the loft in the church that puzzled some people who have seen it. It is made of green fabric and images are sewn onto it. The images are a lion, an eagle, a human face, and an ox. Each image has wings. People want to know the meaning and some are too timid to ask about it.

This banner has the symbols of the four Gospels. The early church assigned these images to the evangelists and they stuck. If you wish to compare them to something that is more modern, they are the computer screen icons for the Gospels.

My home parish has statues of the evangelists in the alcoves in the old main altar. I learned, a long time ago, that the statues depicted Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John in that order from left to right. There were plaques attached to the foot of each statue that had the symbol of each evangelist.

Our banner at the loft in back of the church does not go in the same order.

The first image on our banner is the lion. It is assigned to Saint Mark. If you have been to Venice, the Cathedral's patron is Saint Mark. There is a column in the piazza with a statue of the lion on top of it. The characteristic of the gospel that the icon communicates is courage.

The image in the upper right quadrant is the eagle. It is assigned to Saint John. The Gospel communicates the divinity of Jesus. Like an eagle is able to soar, the early Christians were able to see that character in the Gospel according to John.



The third image at the lower left is the human face, sometimes called an angel. It is assigned to Saint Matthew. The Gospel communicates the human character of Jesus, the Son of God made man.

The symbol on the lower right is the ox for Saint Luke. It denotes Luke's communication of service, strength, and sacrifice that Jesus outlined for the Church. Oxen were used by farmers to pull the plow or a wagon. They were also offered in sacrifice to God.

When our parishioners see that banner that is usually displayed during ordinary time, we should remember the inspiration they received from the Church's faith account of what Jesus did while he lived among us in the flesh and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit that made the evangelists commit the story to paper.

May we live the words of the Gospel.


North American Martyrs Parish Novena


