

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

One of the duties that pastors celebrate is the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. The priest, the sick person and the community present pray together for the recovery of the sick person with God's grace. The outward signs of the sacrament are the laying on of hands and the anointing with the Oil of the Infirm.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that: The special grace of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects:

- the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church;

- the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age;

- the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance;

- the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;

- the preparation for passing over to eternal life.

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

(Jas 5:14-15).

I have seen the effects of the sacrament demonstrated in a number of ways. Some people make their peace with God through the sacrament and relax in peace. Others, who were in critical condition, find healing and recover. Still others open themselves to God's will and heroically pick up their cross and walk with Jesus.

Recently I notice a trend that could be changed. The person who usually calls the rectory requesting the sacrament is part of the hospice care system. This is not the most expedient way for me to get the information that I need. Family members are the best way for me to receive information about the person who needs the sacrament. Family members are usually the primary care givers and can tell me if the person can or cannot receive Holy Communion. Family members do not have to look in their records for the sick person's address or when is the best time to visit the sick person.

Therefore, if you have a family member who needs to be anointed, call me yourself. Do not have a hospice person do it. You have the best information about the person who needs anointing and it will save some time on my part. Do not wait for the sick person to draw their last breath before you call me. It is best when the sick person has the knowledge about what is going on and can participate in the process. When the sick person joins in the prayer with me and other people present, it strengthens the sick person in spirit.

God gives the Church the great gift of the sacraments. The Church invites the faithful to participate in God's grace given through the sacraments that lead us to eternal life. May we take full advantage of God's gifts to us.

A Message from Bishop McManus ...

"Whenever we encounter a poor person, we cannot look away, for that would prevent us from encountering the face of the Lord Jesus." (Pope Francis, Message for the Seventh Annual World Day of the Poor)

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For over 38 million Americans, there is a thin line between eviction and home, between hunger and health, between unemployment and work, between anxiety and stability. This line is the Poverty Line. Nationally, for a family of four, that line is \$25,750 a year.

Since 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has addressed poverty by

attacking its causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. That's why the CCHD theme is "Help Those on the Margins." This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs.

This year, seventy-five percent of the collection will stay here in our diocese. Each November I meet with our parish and community groups which receive local grants from the previous year's collection. It is always inspiring to see how these small grants blossom into effective programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margins. Given our economy's high inflation rate, the need has increased dramatically in the many food pantries and emergency assistance programs in our parishes and Catholic agencies which receive support from our local CCHD funds.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. We are "working on the margins" in Central Massachusetts and across America. Support the CCHD Collection on November 18 & 19 as a response to the Seventh Annual World Day of the Poor that Sunday as called for by our Holy Father. 
We are still collecting donations for our attic treasures table until November 21. Please call Lisa to arrange a day and time for drop off at the parish center.
