

We celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent this week. We await the celebration of the birth of Christ at Christmas. We also await the coming of Christ at the end of time. Last week we celebrated Saint Nicholas. His story inspires generosity directed toward the care of children. It contributes to the spirit of

Christmas, remembering the care and generosity that God inspires in the revelation of His Son.



Wednesday will bring the celebration of Saint Lucy, the virgin and martyr. She was also concerned with the care of children and was generous in sharing the family wealth with people in need. Her name has the same Latin root as the word, light. During the darkest time of the year in the northern hemisphere, we celebrate a saint whose light shines among us.
