Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,



Advent is very short this year. Next weekend we will celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent on Christmas Eve. I will celebrate masses in the morning and evening on that Sunday Manday will be

and evening on that Sunday. Monday will be Christmas Day.

The calendar will not allow me to decorate the church on Christmas Eve. Decoration day will have to be pushed back to Saturday, December 23. Parishioners who wish to be part of the decoration party should come to the church on Saturday at about 9:00 a.m. to begin to set up the manger scene, take down the purple and put up the red, erect the

Christmas tree and decorate it, place the poinsettias, and change the bows on the wreaths from purple to red. We will retain the purple banners near the altar and the candle banners on the choir loft until we finish mass on Sunday.

One celebration of Advent that is still available for Christians is the forgiveness of sin. I heard the first confessions of the Holy Communion class on Saturday. I will be available for confession on Saturday, December 23 at the usual time. People who wish to go to confession to another priest should find out when they are available for confession. Some parishes will have a Penance Service during this week. You may make an appointment with me to hear your confession at another time.

Catholic Art Calendars for 2024 are in the back of the church. Britton Funeral Home makes them available to our parish. They have nice large squares around each date to pencil in appointments. If you cannot find one in back of the church today, please ask me to get one out of the storeroom for you so you can begin planning for 2024.

The calendars deliver the dates for Church celebrations throughout the year. They remind you of Holydays of Obligation. They mark the liturgical seasons. They display some very beautiful Christian art that reminds us of the mysteries of our faith.

I will put up the Christmas trees in the rectory this week. I hope all the lights work! It provides a meditation that during the darkest time of the year in the northern hemisphere, the lights of Christmas shine brightly. We take much of it for granted. We plug our tree lights into an electric outlet and the brilliance of many tiny bulbs instantly illuminates with a steady light. I remember my grandmother talk about Christmas trees when she was young. They put slight tapered candles on the tree. Everyone had to be still while the tree was lit. It took more than a few matches to illuminate all the candles. Then everyone was vigilant so no fire would burn the tree. They could only light up the tree on Christmas Day and only for a few hours. How times have changed!

Third Sunday of Advent

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:16 - 18)

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

Did You Know? Internet Safety for Kids

The Internet has become the new schoolyard for child molesters seeking girls or boys to victimize. Internet "chat rooms" provide a teenager with an opportunity to engage in a "live" conversation with friends from school or church, or with other teenagers from around the world. A chat room is similar to an old-style telephone party line, except that the teens are typing. Law enforcement has found that child molesters use chat rooms to gain easy and safe access to teens. Because of the seemingly caring and seductive talent of child molesters, teenagers should be warned that when they are in a chat room, they should never provide anyone with private information, personal information, and especially their specific physical location.


