

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Happy New Year! We will take down the old calendars this week and put up the new ones. Some of us will make New Year resolutions. Most of us will enjoy a holiday.



January 1 will celebrate Mary, the Holy Mother of God. This year it is not a holyday of obligation. When it falls on a Monday or Saturday it is still a great feast, but the obligation to participate at mass does not remain. I will only celebrate one mass on Monday at



9:00 a.m. We will not anticipate the holyday with a vigil mass on Sunday. Participation at mass on the first day of the New Year is a great way to start 2024. Even without the obligation, honoring Mary on January 1 is a humble way to express our gratitude for her intercession, her example, and her contribution to our redemption by her Son.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Many parishioners will want to receive a statement of their contributions for 2023 to Saint Joseph Parish so they can prepare their tax returns. We record your donations each week that come in the mail and in the collections. I will review the contributions to make sure they are as accurate as possible. I will prepare the letter that reports your donations. I will distribute the letters to you at mass on a number of weekends. The New Year is an opportunity to make new plans. Take this opportunity to plan spiritual activity for 2024. This might be the year to participate in a retreat. You may plan to go on a religious pilgrimage this year. You may participate in a bible study or take a college course in theology, try scripture. Try something new!





The Solemnity of Mary is not a holyday of obligation this year. There will not be an 8:00AM Mass on January 1.


