

- -Thank you to the people who participated as readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, and servers.
- —Thank you to the people who took up the collection and served as ushers and welcomed people to the church.
- —Thank you to people who brought friends and family to church to pray who do not usually join us.

Thank you to the people who sent cards and gifts to the rectory to help me celebrate the season. I have enough cookies to see me through to Ash Wednesday!!

We continue the Christmas season this weekend as we celebrate the visit of the Magi. Next week we will remember the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan by Saint John and that will conclude the Christmas liturgical cycle. Some people will extend the season a bit until we celebrate the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. We give thanks to God for the gift of His Son.

The secular press has spent many words about the Holy Father and the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith releasing the declaration, *Fiducia Suplicans* (Supplicating Trust) on the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings. Much of what is published is not correct. Please do not believe everything you read in popular media.

You may read the original document in an official English translation on the Vatican website. Go to the Roman Curia from the main page of the Holy See. Go further to the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith and you will find the document there. It is long.

I think that reporters failed to read the original document to publish what is in the popular media. The Dicastery made extensive explanation of blessings and God's bestowal upon people through the ministry of the Church. The important point that the Holy Father and the Dicastery makes is that the Church does not bless a sin. The Church does bless sinners to call them to holiness.

When I bless people at the end of mass I do not require a Church membership card, nor a moral account of their behavior to receive a blessing. The blessing is for all. The blessing is bestowed to everyone in the church calling all of us to holiness and grace.


Only Christmas items will be accepted. We do not have the storage space for other donations at this time.
