



Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

The Church begins Lent this week. Ash Wednesday is this week. I will celebrate mass and distribute ashes in the morning, at noon, and in the evening. We may not have a mass for Ash Wednesday on Tuesday evening.

Remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence in the Church. While fasting does not apply to the very young, the very old, and the sick, abstinence applies to all Catholics. The practice of fasting and abstinence are the minimum acts of penance required by the Church. She encourages all members to do other acts of faith and charity throughout Lent in humility before God. The Gospel for Ash Wednesday gives us Divine Guidance: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsaivina.



Please remember that Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both days of fast and abstinence. The rest of the Fridays of Lent are only days of abstinence.

I will celebrate the Stations of the Cross on the Friday evenings in Lent. We will use three different versions of the Stations liturgy. Books will be available on the table in the middle of the church throughout Lent for people who wish to pray the stations at another time. Please return the books back to the table in the middle of the church so other people might take the opportunity for prayer.

Ash Wednesday falls on the same day as Valentine's Day. Saint Valentine would have recognized the precedence of Ash Wednesday over the celebration of his feast. Valentine celebrations could take place before we enter Lent. It is important to celebrate romantic love. I do not advise a gift of chocolate to a person who usually does not eat it during Lent, unless you wish to torture that person with great temptation.

CRS Rice Bowl is Catholic Relief Services' Lenten faith-in-action program and it is an opportunity for our parish to support our sisters and brothers around the world—especially people experiencing poverty, hunger and the effects of climate change.

This year, through CRS Rice Bowl, we will encounter communities in Uganda, El Salvador and Indonesia. Furthermore, participating in CRS Rice Bowl will help us engage daily with the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

When you pick up your Rice Bowl, you'll also receive a Lenten calendar that offers short reflections for each day of Lent.


Make sure to put together this cardboard box and use it to

A Message from Bishop McManus ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When a young man is ordained, you, his parishioners, become his family and he becomes your spiritual father. Through the joys of Baptisms, First Holy Communions, Confirmations and Weddings, the priest is at the heart of parish and family life. When sickness, strain, tragedy and death strike, your spiritual father is there to steady you, reassure you and give you hope by pointing to Jesus Christ and to the mystery of his suffering, death, and resurrection.


As family members, we grow with our priests. In time, we or they move on, but their love, support and lessons remain with us. Like every family there comes a time when those who have nourished, nurtured, and supported us grow old and need our support.

On Ash Wednesday we will hold a collection at all Masses for the support of our 49 priests who have retired in good standing. Our expenses for retired priests include a monthly stipend, medical insurance, nursing care and, for some, assisted living and nursing home costs. Last year our total cost for priest retirement was \$2,390,298.

These retired priests have served with dedication, fidelity, and love. Many continue to serve. Four remain in parishes full time as senior priests. Others have stepped in to administer parishes and say daily Mass. Still others regularly fill in on weekends, cover vacations and serve in prison ministry and on Diocesan Boards and the Tribunal.


On their behalf, I thank you for your prayers and support of them in their retirement years.
