Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Lent began on Wednesday. People came to mass on Wednesday and received ashes reminding us that we are dust and to dust we will return. It is a meditation on our mortality and our ultimate destiny to be with God.

Many people respond to the Gospel that instructs us to repent from sin. The Church celebrates the sacraments of Baptism and Penance to bring people to reconciliation with God. We receive Baptism with water and the Holy Spirit but once and then celebrate our Baptism throughout our lives. We remember and long for that state of

grace that we experienced after our Baptism. Temptation, ignorance, and weakness can lead us to sin. Jesus came to bring grace and reconciliation to sinners.

The Church celebrates the Sacrament of Penance to restore us to that state of grace that we experienced at Baptism. It heals our spirit and reconciles our relationship with God and our community. Lent is that season that invites the faithful to examine our conscience and reach out for forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance.

There was a recent revision to the Order of Penance. All the revisions apply to the priest who is hearing the confession. Nothing changed for the penitent.

Some people say that they forgot how to go to confession. If that is so for you, there are small cards in the confessional that quickly instruct you how to go to confession, including an act of contrition for the penitent. They are in a stack on the table near the crucifix and the candles. You may pick one up for yourself.

Some people are puzzled by the penance they receive during confession. They ask, "How can a few prayers even come close to taking away some of the evil I have done?" The early Church gave severe penance to penitents. The severe penances were not productive in reconciling the sinner. The Church also remembered that Jesus suffered and died and rose from the dead to bring about the forgiveness of sin. The penance we do after confession is but a token of our repentance and our resolve not to sin again.

Some people do not want to have their pastor for a confessor. There are many priests in the Diocese of Worcester who will hear your confession. Our deanery plans to have a Lenten penance celebration so penitents could have access to confessors who are not their pastors. Our deanery will celebrate the Sacrament of Penance for the faithful on Monday, March 4, at 7:00 p.m. at Saint Brigid Church in Millbury. I will be there to hear confessions and so will all the other priests of our deanery. You may choose to whom you wish to confess your sin.



You now have a couple of weeks to prepare. If you miss the deanery's event, you may still come to confession on Saturday at 3:00 p.m. or make an appointment with a priest.

LENTEN GUIDELINES FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty-nine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

A Lenten Message from Bishop McManus ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Jesus is calling us deeper." That reminder of our threeyear National Eucharistic Revival is intended to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus in the Holy Eucharist" (www.eucharisticrevival.org). That call of renewal through a deepened relationship with

Christ is particularly apt in this season of Lent.

We have begun our fortyday journey of deepened prayer, more frequent penance, and greater charity. We embark on the journey because we are sinners in need of and called to repentance by Jesus Christ. Lent's annual




journey also prepares us for the fruitful celebration of the Paschal Mystery—from the Last Supper on Holy Thursday and His Passion and Death on Good Friday to his Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

The forty penitential days of Lent derive from Jesus' forty days of prayer and fasting in the desert. They also call to mind Moses' forty days on Mount Sinai during the forty-year journey of the Israelites through the desert to the Promised Land.

In addition to Lenten penances and almsgiving, please consider going to weekday Masses and making visits to the Church outside of Mass to adore the Lord whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance. Through a greater Eucharistic devotion, we will appreciate, even more, Christ's presence to us, the graces He offers at every Mass, and the peace and comfort of a prayerful visit to Church. Thus, nourished and strengthened, we will be better equipped to meet life's challenges, reflect God's love, and make progress on our journey to Him.
