





#### A Message from Bishop McManus ...

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In these days of continuing turmoil around the world, I invite you to "Reveal Christ's love" by supporting the national Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Collection on the weekend of March 17. Catholic Relief Services supports Catholic Church organizations that carry out international relief and resettlement for victims of persecution, war, and natural disasters; development projects to improve living conditions for the poor; legal and support services for poor immigrants; and peace and reconciliation work for people suffering from violence.



In the developing world, it is often hard for families to support themselves and their children. Sophie, a widow working in a village in Burkina Faso, was struggling to feed her family and pay for schooling for her children. Thanks to the help of Catholic Relief Services, her village was able to set up a Savings and Internal Lending Community (SILC). Local members contribute what they can afford and pool their resources to meet pressing needs or develop business opportunities. Through the SILC, Sophie was able to take out a \$200 loan to cover startup costs for her own canteen. She began to pay off her loan in only six months. Her community has benefited too, as she has been able to hire three assistants to work with her.

For more than 75 years, CRS has been providing expertise and compassion to the very poorest of our brothers and sisters in more than 100 countries. But we can't do this lifesaving work without your help.
