

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

The Gospel on Ash Wednesday highlighted three Lenten practices: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The gospel related Jesus' advice that we should pray in secret, and the Father who sees in secret will repay you.

Jesus' own example of prayer guides us to that goal. Jesus pulls away from the crowds on a number of occasions to be alone with the Father in prayer. The First Sunday of Lent told us that he went into the desert for forty days. That was a very long retreat, but deemed necessary by Jesus in response to the Spirit before he began his public ministry in Galilee.



The Gospels also let us eavesdrop on the conversation

between Jesus and the Father. It was an ongoing conversation that was not confined to words alone, but also communicated through actions.

Some people use Lent to enhance that communication with God. One important way to do that is to include the Scripture in our prayer. The psalms were the hymnody that the Hebrew people used in the Temple. They are set in verse and, in Hebrew, have a scheme to help the person easily remember the psalm. Unfortunately, the scheme does not translate into English. But the thoughts and prayer of the psalmist do translate well into English with the help of skilled translators.

The Psalms are attributed to King David. It is easy to sometimes think of the young David watching the sheep and goats in the field and plucking a musical instrument to add to the spirit of the verse he composes to the glory of God. The Psalms run the gamut of spiritual thoughts and emotions. There are psalms of thanksgiving as well as psalms of grief.

Many people find it difficult to open their hearts and spirits to God and it may seem that God does not respond quickly. The poor soul will then continue to flood the conversation with their own thoughts and words. A critical element of prayer is the conversation. Let God begin the dialogue with words from the scriptures and we can easily respond.

Some people like to use structured prayers to communicate their thoughts and feelings to God. The rosary is a common vehicle for such prayer. The constant repetition and the rhythm move the person to intimate communion with God. This works too.

Remember Jesus' warning in the Ash Wednesday Gospel that advises against long-winded prayer. "When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them." And in another place, "In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words." Engage God and get to the point.

May your prayer bring you closer to God. May God answer your prayers with grace.


Did You Know?
