



Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

A few weeks ago, I was waiting for a haircut at the local tonsorial parlor. Another patron looked me over and remarked that he thought he knew me. He asked if I was a priest, I was not dressed in black, it was Wednesday, my day off. I said that I am the pastor of St. Joseph Church in Auburn. He responded that he had come to mass with a friend of his who had a mass offered for a deceased relative.

He then made a comment that he thought I was under great stress because after mass, as I left the altar, my head was down. I had to laugh at that comment because I put my head down when I leave the altar so I can look over my tri-focal lenses so I have an accurate location for the steps near the altar. If I do not put my head down, the image I get through the lower part of my lenses does not let me place my feet accurately and I am certain that my face would meet the floor. We laughed at his observation and assumption that I was under great stress.

Given that encounter with a stranger, I wonder how many people in the parish are concerned that I put my head down as I leave the altar from mass. I put my head down to accurately watch where I am walking. I avoid stumbling and falling. It seems to work for me!

Last week I did not celebrate mass in Auburn on Saturday. My niece's family invited me to come to Maine and celebrate her son's first communion and confirmation. My thanks to Father Leo-Paul LeBlanc, a retired priest of the diocese, for covering the confessions and mass at St. Joseph Parish on Saturday.

The Catholic Church in the United States continues to observe a

Eucharistic Revival. One element of the revival is the Eucharistic Congress planned for July this year. It will take place in Indianapolis, Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium. 
