



Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,



We celebrated the feast of Saint Joseph, the Worker on Wednesday. Happy belated feast day! Our parish did celebrate Saint Joseph Day on March 19. That Feast is solemnity – the highest rank of a Church celebration. It celebrates Saint Joseph as the spouse of Mary, the Mother of Jesus.

The feast we celebrated on Wednesday is different. It remembers Saint Joseph as a worker. It would be relevant to many of our parishioners who spent much of their lives employed as workers following Joseph's example of being a technician who worked at building and construction. Many of us like to think of Saint Joseph as a carpenter. Wood is a scarce commodity in Israel. If Joseph made his living only working with wood, he would have starved. Most scholars anticipate that he

worked with a variety of materials. Part of the celebration of Saint Joseph the worker is the blessing of tools and other equipment for work. It is a holy Labor Day.

Much of the world celebrates Labor Day on May 1. Countries who have association with socialist / communist leanings are more likely to celebrate Labor Day on May 1. The Holy Father, Pope Pius XII instituted the celebration of Saint Joseph, the Worker on May 1 to balance the socialist / communist emphasis upon the supremacy of workers in society. Saint Joseph was a humble worker, using his talent and skill to support Mary and Jesus in Nazareth. Work contributes to the dignity of the human person. It is a noble endeavor when it builds up and supports the goodness God created.

A good meditation on Saint Joseph can be found in the stained glass window above the organ in our church. The workshop is a place of holy endeavor, not only for Joseph, but the whole family. They work together, but not all on the same project.


