Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

I will go on retreat this week. It will be at the Notre Dame Spirituality Center in Ipswich, MA. The Office of Ongoing Priestly Formation, Fr. Falco, found the center available last year. It is a huge complex with lots of room. I enjoyed being there last year. There is room to walk and enjoy the spring air.

The retreat master will be Father Dennis McManus of the Archdiocese of Mobile, Alabama. His resumé had more entries in it than I cared to count. It

looks like he couldn't hold a job for long. Much of his ministry has been in seminaries.

Saint Joseph Parish will not celebrate mass in the church this week, as I will be away. The retreat usually does not take many priests away from the diocese, usually only about twenty. I anticipate that most of the parishes in the area will celebrate masses on the usual schedule.

The Church directs priests to go on retreat each year: Code of Canon Law, No. 276.2. I take that direction seriously. The focus of the retreat is spiritual activity. Some people think that priests are usually focused on spiritual activity, why go on retreat to do it? If nothing else, the retreat refocuses the person to prayer, spiritual exercise, relationship with God, and some quiet to destress and center.

While I am on retreat, I will pray for you and your spiritual development. I ask that you will pray for me during this week that God's grace will be upon me to refresh and renew me.

When I return, I will write about what the retreat master presented to us. I usually do that every year to give you some of the benefit that I received on the retreat.



How Old Does a Child Need to Be in Order to Stay Alone?

Don't assume that when your child understands what you're saying, he's ready to walk out the door by himself. Besides the fact that many states have laws against leaving children of certain ages alone (for example, younger than 12), experts say children shouldn't be left by themselves until they're capable of fighting off an abductor or handling a crisis situation. Experts also say children do not have the mental maturity to cross busy streets by themselves until they're about 10 or 12 years old. (Did you know that pedestrian injuries rank third in child fatalities, behind traffic accidents and drowning?) Finally, parents who are certain their young children would never walk away with a stranger will be shocked to learn that studies show they probably will. Stay alert and vigilant, even if you believe your child is aware of possible dangers from others.
