

Thank you to all the people who participated in the Yard Sale on May 18. The donors supplied good merchandise. The people who prepared for the event did great work. The sellers were superb. The clean-up crew did great. Thank you to the people who supported the sale with your patronage. We raised \$1200 on the day of the sale. The weather call was very accurate at the start of the day. While it would have been nice to be outside, the rain came and it would have been a mad dash to get back inside the Center.

The sale moved a good amount of the goods we have on hand. The money helps the parish stay in good financial standing, and parishioners worked together very well.

I anticipate that parishioners will work very well again in a few weeks to have the BBQ chicken dinner bring people together at a delicious meal.

That same weekend there was an unusual media event. CBS broadcast an interview with Pope Francis hosted by Norah O'Donnell. It is rare that the Holy Father grants such interviews as every news outlet in the world would like to get him in front of the camera in an exclusive interview.

The first segment was broadcast on *60 Minutes* on May 19. Then there was another hour-long broadcast later in the week. It was unfortunate that the second broadcast was late in the evening. If you can review the broadcast online or on demand, I recommend that you enjoy the interview.



The Holy Father clarified some of the misunderstandings that have been broadcast about him and the policies he promotes. I found the translation of the interview, the Pope spoke in Italian, to be very accurate.

Here are some of the salient points:

- Holy Orders is for males only. Women make great contributions to the work of the church. Women's participation is valuable and essential to the life of the Church.
- The Church bestows blessings upon all people. The Church does not bless the union between same sex couples, but blesses the people.
- Refugees are people who must be treated with respect.
- Surrogacy is not an acceptable way to have children. Adoption is a way that couples may enjoy and raise children that gives love.
- The Holy Father is not yet thinking about retiring. He still has much work to do.

The review of salient points does not include the Holy Father's warm expression and understanding that comes across in the interview.



Tickets are on sale after all masses the weekends of June 1 & 2, June 8 & 9 and June 15 & 16, or at the rectory and parish center.



According to the Gospel of John (19:33), when Jesus was dying on the cross "one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water." The celebration of the Sacred Heart is associated with the physical wound (and the associated sacrifice), the "mystery" of both blood and water pouring from Christ's chest, and the devotion God asks from humankind.

Pope Pius XII wrote about the Sacred Heart in his 1956 encyclical, Haurietis Aquas (On Devotion To The Sacred Heart): Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is devotion to Jesus Christ Himself, but in the particular ways of meditating on His interior life and on His threefold love: His divine love, His burning love that fed His human will, and His sensible love that affects His interior life.
