

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

The hot summer weather is coming. Some climatologists suggest that the summer of 2024 will be severe in New England. They have been wrong in the past – let's see if their predictions will come true this year.

Remember that your parents and grandparents who formed and built Saint Joseph Church did not have air conditioning put into the construction plan. Early photos of the church do not even have the ceiling fans in place. They were added later. Open windows usually provided ventilation in the warmest months. Did your parents and grandparents figure that you would add the air conditioning into the building?

I usually open the building early in the morning. When there is a forecast for hot weather I will open the windows on a cool morning to bring the cooler air into the building. I will start the fans turning to circulate the air. The church is a brick building and the bricks hold the heat from the daytime sun. It is a difficult building to cool.

When the indoor temperature is lower than the warmer outdoor temperature I will keep the windows closed to preserve the cooler temperature in the building.


Circumstances change from the time I open the church and the time that you arrive. I usually do not check the situation constantly because I am in the sacristy preparing for mass. If you enter the building and notice that the outside temperature and air quality is preferred to the inside situation, please open a window. If the outside air is less comfortable than the inside temperature and the windows are open, please close windows to keep it cool. The situation usually does not affect me because there are no windows near the altar.

I will activate the fans in the ceiling and circulate the air when it is hot. Moving air feels cooler than stagnant air.

When it is very hot, I will place a cooler with chilled bottled water on the lower shelf of the table that is in the middle of the church. If you need cold water, please help yourself to a bottle of water to drink. If you just need some time in cooler air, the lower level of the church is usually cooler. Go down the stairwell and spend some time there. Splash cool water on your face and neck if you feel severe heat stress in the restroom in the back of the church.


Heat stress can cause a person to be a heat casualty. We do not want that to happen in the church. Be sure to drink fluids during the hot summer months.

Keep the doors of the church closed during mass. There are chipmunks and other voles that live in



Think cool thoughts. Be aware of the situation of the person near you in the church and assist them if they need some help, bring them water, give them a towel with cold water if they need it.

Remember that we prayed for these hot days when it was icy in January and February. May God grant us comfortable days on weekends so we can focus upon the Eucharist when we come to church.

Volunteers are needed, call the parish center at 508-832-6683, if you would like to help. Promises to be a great time. Join the fun!!!




Tips for Summer Camp Safety
