

### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Saint Joseph parishioners donate to the parish in a number of ways. Some parishioners notice that some people do not place an envelope in the basket each week and wonder why everyone doesn't contribute. The most usual response is that they do contribute, but they do not use the weekly envelope system each week.



Most parishioners do use the weekly envelope system. People receive their envelopes in the mail every two months and fill their envelopes each week, bring them to mass on Saturday or Sunday, and place them in the basket when collectors place the basket before them. They respond with the regular weekly stewardship offering and, when a second envelope is in the packet for a particular weekend, they fill and deposit the second envelope as well.

Some parishioners do the same, except that they do it all at once. They receive their packet of envelopes, and make one check for all the collections in the envelope and

turn it all in at one time. The people who open the envelopes break the check into cash and direct the money to each of the separate funds. Other people make it easier for the people who open envelopes and place cash in each envelope, but still turn it all in at once. Some parishioners do break it down to the individual month.

Some contributions come in the mail. Even though the parishioners come to mass each week, they put their contributions in the mail and do not place them in the basket.

Some parishioners use Bill Pay at their bank to contribute to the parish. They instruct the bank to send us a check and the parish receives the check and applies it to the appropriate collection. I contribute in this fashion. I make a bank transfer from my bank directly into the parish's account. It is immediate and handles no cash.

Some parishioners fill out the automatic deduction form and provide the parish with a voided check. UniBank then uses the Automated Clearing House (ACH) facility to deduct

contributions from the donor's account and deposit it into the parish account. Some people contribute weekly. Others contribute once each month.

Mrs. Ashton, Mr. Archibald, and I work to keep all these revenue streams in order and account for all the money that comes into the parish.

Thank you to all the people who contribute to the support of the parish and various other collections that the parish and diocese support.

Thank you to the people who pass the basket each week and secure the collection in a safe place until mass is over.

Thank you to the people who open the envelopes and account for all the money that comes to the parish.

Any parishioner who does not receive envelopes and would like to receive them should call the rectory and request them. If you fail to receive your packet, there are a number of blank sets in the plastic containers near the main doors of the church. Please put your name on the blank envelope and your envelope number if you know it.


