#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

This week I received a letter from Bishop McManus notifying me that Saint Joseph Parish has not yet reached our goal for the 2024 Partners in Charity Appeal which is \$60,700. So far, only 129 people have donated \$46,117 which he reports is 76% of the goal. To reach our goal we need \$14,583 in more gifts.



He requests that, since this parish has yet to reach goal, that I do all I possibly can over the next few weeks in promoting a special Partners in Charity Gift Weekend. Bishop McManus states that he remains optimistic that this goal is still achievable with my support.

To assist me in this endeavor, he supplied the following bulletin announcement. He reminded me that our appeal concludes on August 31. He asks that those who previously gave and have not yet given this year might consider supporting the Appeal this year.

The *Catholic Free Press* will announce this special collection in the hope that many will see the article and be reminded of the importance of each gift.

129 people have already donated and for those gifts we are truly grateful.

This year the diocesan campaign has been impacted by fewer gifts of support. So, it will be a great challenge to reach its goal of \$5 million (as will many other annual campaigns.)

Your gift will help the Diocese implement its essential charitable, pastoral and educational works in the year ahead. Tens of thousands of people are the beneficiaries of our charitable giving.

Just a few examples are the care of fifty-two retired priests ~ poor families served by Pernet Family Health Service ~ seniors receiving home health care through Catholic Charities ~ children seeking a good education ~ those preparing for the priesthood or diaconate ~ the developmentally disabled at Mercy Centre. But there is much more!

Hopefully, you will consider making a gift from your generosity and spirit of sacrifice. It takes many gifts to reach our diocesan goal of \$5 million.

#### A Message from Bishop McManus ...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has often spoken of the need for Christians to evangelize others through accompaniment. For Central and Eastern Europeans living in countries that experienced 70 years of communist oppression, the Church especially needs to accompany people to an encounter with Christ that is patient, understanding, and filled with hope instead of fear, anger, and anxiety.

In Slovakia, the Alexis Counseling Center has accompanied nearly 2,500 women and their loved ones with devotion. Since 2010, the center has provided counseling to women experiencing the anxieties of an unplanned pregnancy or the grief of pregnancy loss, as well as to their spouses, family members, and friends. In addition to promoting psychological healing, the




center also helps vulnerable women who have experienced miscarriages and abortions to find housing, material and financial assistance, and support groups.

In Albania, lay people are preparing for lay ministries as catechists and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion through a three-year study program that provides in-depth knowledge of the Gospel, the Church, and sacraments, liturgy, and spirituality. This formation program equips participants to be active, faith-filled agents of evangelization and accompaniment to those who desire to know Christ and the Church.

Ministries of accompaniment such as these are made possible with grant monies raised through the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. When you support this collection on the weekend of August 11, you help the Church in more than 25 other countries accompany people who still experience the hardships and wounds caused by communism.
