

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

As I prepared for mass on Monday, I read the first reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Thessalonians. I was struck by the similarity that I saw in St. Paul's relationship with the Church in Thessalonica and the relationship I have with St. Joseph Church in Auburn. Unfortunately for Saint Paul, he spent most of his time away from that Church. He went on his missionary journeys instructing many people in the wisdom of the Gospel. I, on the other hand, spend most of my time in Auburn.

I hope that you will see the similarities as I quote the reading below:

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to the Church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We ought to thank God always for you, brothers and sisters, as is fitting, because your faith flourishes ever more, and the love of every one of you for one another grows ever greater. Accordingly, we ourselves boast of you in the churches of God regarding your endurance and faith in all your persecutions and the afflictions you endure.

This is evidence of the just judgment of God, so that you may be considered worthy of the Kingdom of God for which you are suffering.

We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith, that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, in accord with the grace of our God and Lord Jesus Christ.



Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord. Traditionally, this suffering was not limited to the passion and death event; rather, it comprised the seven dolors or seven sorrows of Mary, which were foretold by the Priest Simeon who proclaimed to Mary, This child [Jesus] is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed and you yourself shall be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare (Luke 2:34-35.) These seven sorrows of our Blessed Mother included the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt; the loss and finding of the child Jesus in the Temple; Mary's meeting of Jesus on His way to Calvary; Mary's standing at the foot of the cross when our Lord was crucified; her holding of Jesus when He was taken down from the cross; and then our Lord's burial. In all, the prophesy of Simeon that a sword would pierce our Blessed Mother's heart was fulfilled in these events. For this reason, Mary is sometimes depicted with her heart exposed and with seven swords piercing it. More importantly, each new suffering was received with the courage, love, and trust that echoed her fiat, let it be done unto me according to Thy word, first uttered at the Annunciation. Items most needed are macaroni & cheese, canned soups, tuna, cereal, peanut butter, jelly and pasta.




Food collections will be donated to Auburn Youth and Family Services.

Safe Environment Training

Any volunteer working with children is mandated by the diocese of Worcester to complete a one-time Safe Environment training. If you currently volunteer or may volunteer in the future with parish groups such as religious education, Knights of Columbus, parish events, and have not completed a safe environment training, contact the religious education office at 508-832 6683 to make arrangements.

We offer an in-person training at the parish center, 68 Central St. on **Monday, September 9, 6:30pm.** We also offer an online tutorial for you through the diocese of Worcester. If you have completed the training in the past, you only need to submit a new CORI application with a copy of your license.

We cannot have any volunteers working with our children who have not completed this training.

Participants taking the online class also need to complete a CORI form and submit a copy of their license, which is also provided from the religious ed office.
