#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,



The Church will soon begin a new liturgical calendar for 2025. The liturgical calendar begins on the First Sunday of Advent, this year it will be on December 1. Pastors must look forward to see what must be prepared so that the liturgical celebrations will have the necessary resources to celebrate each event as the Universal Church plans it.

When I looked at the new calendar, I focused on Easter. Easter is a movable feast the Church celebrates on the lunar phase. It falls after the first full moon of spring. We

will celebrate Easter on April 20 in 2025. It will be much later than when we celebrated it in 2024. Easter is when the Church welcomes new members into the Church through Baptism and the other sacraments of initiation. It is also the opportunity that the Church takes to welcome people who were validly baptized in another Church and now wish to become part of the Catholic Church.

The Catholic Church does not welcome older children and adults into the Church without first instructing them about the practice of the faith. Older children and adults must be committed to the Church's doctrine and practice. If the Church welcomed an adult person into the Church without informing them about the doctrines and practices, it would be unjust to the person who would be baptized.

The process for welcoming people into the Church is the Order of Christian Initiation of Children or Adults. It was formerly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, usually abbreviated to RCIA. We can begin this process now, and the candidates would be ready for baptism by Easter.

People who are eligible for this process fall into these categories:

- People who have never been baptized in any Church and now wish to be Catholic.
- OCIA A JOURNEY IN FAITH
- People who were validly baptized in another Christian Church and now wish to become Catholic.
- People who were baptized in the Catholic Church, but were never raised in the faith and now want to be active in the faith.
- People who did not receive the sacrament of Confirmation when they were young and now wish to do so. This group will receive Confirmation in a special Confirmation liturgy at the Cathedral in February.

If you or someone you know is in one of these categories, now is the time for them to approach me to begin the process of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children. We will meet together weekly to welcome the individuals to the faith and provide information, spiritual activity, camaraderie, support, and guidance. If any active parishioner wishes to participate in this group, we will be happy to welcome your support.

A person who approaches me about the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is only making a commitment to explore the Catholic faith. A commitment to baptism or any sacrament will come later. I find it a great joy and privilege to welcome people into the Church.

The Internet has become the new schoolyard for child molesters seeking girls or boys to victimize. Internet "chat rooms" provide a teenager with an opportunity to engage in a "live" conversation with friends from school or church, or with other teenagers from around the world. A chat room is similar to an old-style telephone party line, except that the teens are typing. Law enforcement has found that child molesters use chat rooms to gain easy and safe access to teens. Because of the seemingly caring and seductive talent of child molesters, teenagers should be warned that when they are in a chat room, they should never provide anyone with private information, personal information, and especially their specific physical location.


<u>Bazaar</u>
