



#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,


We will celebrate All Saints Day on November 1, next week. It is a holyday of obligation for Catholics. The faithful gather for mass on that holyday. I will celebrate mass on Thursday evening in anticipation of the holyday and on Friday at 8:00 a.m. and noon.

This holyday first began as the celebration of the martyrs in Rome. The early Church paid special attention to people who suffered or gave their lives for the faith. Some were given



a feast day for their commemoration. There were too many martyrs to assign a feast for each one so the Church paid homage to the large number of martyrs on one special day. It was assigned in May. When the Christian faith became the official religion of the Roman Empire, the persecutions ceased. The Church then focused on Christians who lived exemplary holy lives in harmony with the Gospel and teachings of the Church. Eventually they were added to the celebration of the martyrs. It became All Saints Day. The celebration was moved to November 1 in the ninth century.

We honor the saints as we pray for them. May they enjoy the glory of God in the eternal kingdom.



This year, the Commemoration of All Souls, November 2, falls on a Saturday. We usually do not celebrate mass on Saturday morning, but this celebration invites us to remember those friends and family who have died in prayer, especially at mass.

I will celebrate mass on Saturday, November 2, in the morning, remembering all those who you submitted on your envelopes as I celebrate mass. This special celebration should not go by without prayerful remembrance to God of those who have died. I invite all our parishioners to join me in prayer for the faithful departed on November 2.

The Church also recommends that we visit the cemetery and pray at the graves of family and friends buried there. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine on them. May they rest in peace, Amen.

The month of November is dedicated to All Souls. Please pray for deceased relatives and friends throughout the month.




Donations may be brought to the parish center on Monday, Tuesday, or Friday between 10:00am and 3:00pm. Please call ahead to be sure Lisa is available.


