

# Auburn, Massachusetts

#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Parishioners notice that the liturgy at Saint Joseph Church uses different resources to bring a variety of religious experience to the people. For example, people notice the variety of Eucharistic Prayers that come into the liturgy at a regular rotation. There are four regular Eucharistic Prayers that I use in rotation on the weekends. Plus, there are two other Eucharistic Prayers that I use occasionally. One is the Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation that I use during Advent and Lent. Another Eucharist Prayer is available for special celebrations.

Some parishioners notice that other priests gravitate to the Second Eucharistic Prayer. It is the shortest of the Eucharistic Prayers. It has its roots in the celebration of mass for centuries, but was suppressed after the Council of Trent that only approved the Roman Canon (First Eucharistic Prayer) for the Latin Church. The liturgical reform after the Second Vatican Council returned it to the Roman Liturgy along with Eucharistic Prayers Three and Four.

Since the latest revision of the Roman Missal, I have favored the third option of the Penitential Act at the beginning of mass. It is the easiest for both the priest and the faithful people. Recently, I wondered if it would be wise to reintroduce all of the options at mass at Saint Joseph Church. The Sacred Tradition of the Church is contained in the Scriptures. Another source of Sacred Tradition is in the liturgical texts. I think that a broad use of the resources in the Roman Missal will enrich the spiritual life of our parish.

For example, when I prepare for my personal examination of conscience especially when I prepare to participate in the Sacrament of Penance, I use the first option of the Penitential Act, the "I confess to almighty God" prayer. While I can recall that prayer from my memory, without a written text, I anticipate that most parishioners cannot because we do not use it often at mass.

I will begin using options one and two of the Penitential Act starting next weekend. Be prepared to participate. Both are printed on the inside cover of the Breaking Bread books.

I hope that our parishioners will soon commit the first one to memory and be able to use it in their own examination of conscience and preparation for the Sacrament of Penance. It will also broaden our liturgy at mass.

## A Message from Bishop McManus ...

"The World Day of the Poor. . . is a pastoral opportunity not to be underestimated, for it challenges every believer to listen to the prayer of the poor, becoming aware of their presence and needs." (Pope Francis, Message for the Eighth Annual World Day of the Poor 2024)

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For tens of millions of Americans, there is a thin line between eviction and home, between hunger and health, between unemployment and work, between anxiety and stability. This line is the Poverty Line. Nationally, for a family of four, that line is \$31,200 a year.


Since 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has addressed poverty by attacking its causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. That's why the CCHD theme is "Help Those on the Margins." This collection is the primary source of funding for local and national anti-poverty grants and education programs.

This year, seventy-five percent of the collection will stay here in our diocese. Each November I meet with our parish and

community groups that receive local grants from the previous year's collection. It is always inspiring to see how these 20 to 24 small grants blossom into effective programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margins. Given the increasing number of working poor in our communities, the need has increased dramatically in the many food pantries and emergency assistance programs in our parishes and Catholic agencies which receive support from our local CCHD funds.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. We are "working on the margins" in Central Massachusetts and across America. **Support the CCHD Collection on November 23 & 24** as a response to the Eighth Annual World Day of the Poor on Sunday, November 17 as called for by Pope Francis. 
