#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Happy Thanksgiving! We will celebrate the holiday on Thursday. Hopefully, it is part of our culture that permeates the entire year.

We give thanks to God for all gifts when we assemble for mass each day. We gather for the Eucharist, which is *Thanksgiving*. The Greek word from which we derive it is eucharistia or ξύχαριστια.

There are many references in ancient writings of the Fathers to the assembly gathering on Sunday to celebrate Eucharist. They easily could have called it something else, like the Lord's Table, or the Sacred Assembly, or the Breaking of the Bread, or the Holy Meal. Thanksgiving was and is the appropriate and proper label for the celebration that participates in the



mysteries of the faith with a gathering of the faithful in prayer, sharing of the stories, and the communion in the Lord's Body and Blood.

It is most appropriate to share Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day. Both relate to giving thanks and doing so within the Church community is very uplifting. I will celebrate mass in the church on Thursday at 9:00 a.m. We will not celebrate mass in the evening as we usually do on Thursday.

Bring something from your table for blessing in the church. Leave the turkey in the oven. Bread rolls and a bottle of wine are most appropriate. Vegetables are also a good choice.

Bring a gift for the poor to donate to the food pantry. Please bring something that is in a can or box

that we can give to the pantry as we usually donate on the second Sunday of the month. The spirit of thanksgiving bears good fruit when we share the blessings.

Remember that God is the giver of all good things. Be sure to focus on God's generosity and attempt to be as generous with one another.

Another facet of thanksgiving is forgiveness. As we give thanks to God for the forgiveness we receive from him, be generous with forgiveness to people who have hurt us.

#### The Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe

The Solemnity of Christ the King is the final Sunday of the liturgical calendar – the last Sunday of Ordinary Time. The season of Advent begins the following Sunday. The purpose of this feast is to draw our minds and hearts closer to acknowledging the authority and sovereignty of Christ in a society that often forgets or denies His power and



kingship. The reign of Christ does not refer to an earthly power but a divine one. The Solemnity of Christ the King was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI following World War I. Communism, atheism, and secularism were on the rise and the Pope wished to emphasize the authority and sovereignty of Christ. In 1969, Pope Paul VI gave the feast an official title calling it *The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe*


If a tag requests multiple gifts, select only one gift. If a tag is taken, please return a gift. Also, do not include anything edible and do not include batteries, even if required for the gift.
