Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

This year the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is moved from December 8 to December 9. The Second Sunday of Advent ranks higher in the calendar than the observance of the Immaculate Conception, so the observance is moved to Monday. Bishop McManus sent pastors a letter that states that the obligation to attend mass on the holyday is also transferred.

So we will celebrate mass three times on Monday, December 9, and celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on that day. We will not have an anticipated mass on Sunday.

The Immaculate Conception of Mary celebrates the exception granted to her that she was conceived without original sin. It is the beginning of the mystery of redemption and salvation that comes through Jesus, her son, in preparation for his eventual birth.

The Immaculate Conception is also the patron of the United States of America. It is very appropriate that we should pray for her intercession on her feast day for our country. May she intercede for our nation before her son.



Saturday, December 7, is the day for Saint Joseph Christmas Bazaar. It is an annual event that raises money in support of our parish. You will have the opportunity to purchase items that might be gifts for family or friends. Parishioners have donated items for the baked goods booth. They are always delicious. Candy makers are busy creating confections for purchase. Christmas items will be on sale. If you do not want to purchase any items, the raffles will be very active during the Bazaar.

There are two versions: a regular size print that is easy to place in a purse or pocket and a large print version for people who have trouble with the smaller print. Because the large print books are more expensive, we have fewer copies. Please take that version only if you have need for the larger print. The Word Among Us books are there as well.

A Message from Bishop McManus ...


My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of December 8 our parishes will be conducting the appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Religious communities of women and men were devoted to establishing Catholic schools, hospitals, and charitable agencies. Often this progress came at great sacrifice, and many older sisters, brothers, and religious order priests served for little to no pay.

While this annual collection assists those who have retired from their careers, they never retire from their vows and keep the needs of the people they served for a lifetime in their daily prayers. Currently, 71% of the religious communities have a median age of 70 or older, the highest it has been since this national collection began.




