

Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Thank you to all the people who contributed to making the Christmas Bazaar a wonderful event. Thank you to the people who did the preparation work with making, collecting, sorting, pricing, and staging all the items for sale and raffle. Thank you to all the people who donated items to the Bazaar for sale. Thank you to all the sales people who met the customers with smiles, showed them what we had to sell, and did them the honor of taking their money. Thank you to all the customers who purchased items and raffle tickets. The bazaar contributes to the financial health of the parish and the proceeds keeps oil in the furnace, parking lots cleared, the lights lit. Thank you very much.



The Bazaar moves us toward Christmas, but the Church's liturgy speaks of Advent. The Advent season recalls the waiting that people endured before the Messiah arrived. It prepares us for the celebration of Christmas. Our culture ignores Advent. Christmas decorations and gifts go on sale before Halloween. Radio stations and other media begin to play Christmas music about the same time. Much of it is directed toward the purchase of gifts for Christmas. Once Christmas Day passes, the Christmas music vanishes, except in the Church, during the celebration of mass.

I read an article treating this phenomenon written by a priest. He noted that it would be impossible to change the culture. There is no financial advantage to celebrating Advent. The only benefit would be to sell Advent calendars. He was writing from a liturgical perspective that reminded his fellow priests that we have an investment in Advent. Advent is a time of preparation, a time to get ready to celebrate the Birth of the Lord.

He spent some ink writing about the similarities and differences between Advent and Lent. Advent remembers John the Baptist's preparation for the coming of Jesus. He spoke of repentance and making straight the way of the Lord. He suggested that it is a wonderful opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance. Lent is a time of penance and repentance in preparation for the celebration of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Advent is more joyous. Lent is more solemn.

The writer remembers to do a Lenten resolution. He suggested that we might do well to do the same at Advent. We do make New Year resolutions. We make the resolution and they are usually broken and discarded by Ground Hog Day. He suggested that we could "try on" a few New Year resolutions during Advent and bring one or two that we could stick with into the New Year and even into Lent.

Celebrate Advent. Be filled with anticipation as Mary was when she expected her Child. Take a quiet moment of prayer filled with thanksgiving to God for his gift of grace.


If a tag requests multiple gifts, select only one gift. If a tag is taken, please return a gift. Also, do not include anything edible and do not include batteries, even if required for the gift.


