#### Dear People of Saint Joseph Parish,

Winter weather returned this week. People asked me if I planned to cancel mass this winter if we have a snowstorm. How many inches will snow accumulate before I cancel mass? My policy does not

change this year from last. It has worked well and even in the deepest snow people have come to celebrate mass on weekends and during the week. Special thanks to the people who have come with snow shovels and helped clear walkways and stairs.

I usually do not cancel mass because of bad weather. I make it to the church with my boots on and a shovel in the deepest snow. I will only cancel mass if no one comes and I am scheduled to celebrate mass again later in the day.

The only other time that I will cancel mass is if the bishop directs all pastors to cancel mass throughout the diocese. I can put on my gloves, jacket, boots and hat and make it across Oxford Street



North to the church. I have and will start the snow blower to clear a path for me and any people who wish to join me.

The Church advises people to avoid serious hazards when coming to mass on the weekend. Wisdom dictates that when we receive a weather forecast that it will snow on Sunday morning that people would fill the church on Saturday evening when the roads are clear and dry. The converse is also true, when it snows on Saturday evening wise people will postpone their Eucharistic custom and come on Sunday after the streets are cleared.

The company that operates snowplows for the parish is usually prompt with snow removal at the church and rectory lots.

Do not risk your life coming to mass. Be safe and avoid serious hazards when coming to mass. Use intelligent discernment when faced with a weather hazard and when wisdom dictates that you should remain home, stay there and join the Church in prayer while there.

#### The Epiphany of the Lord



The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. "In the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10). Christ's name is chosen in heaven, and the Angel Gabriel announces it when he informs the Blessed Virgin of the incarnation: "Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus". It is a name that has marvelous implications, for it means "savior." The very name bespeaks the magnitude of His mission, His infinite love, a love that will cause Him to offer Himself up for us.

The name of Jesus is the sweetest of all names, and He who bears it is most worthy of all love. He who calls Jesus his friend can be assured that this friend is the most devoted and unselfish of all friends.

Jesus is our all. In His name we may pray to the Father with assurance of being heard. In His name the Church administers all her sacraments. In His name she offers all her prayers and blesses homes, the fields, and the sick. In the name of Jesus she casts out evil spirits, and at the hour of our death bids us, "Go forth, Christian soul." She assures us that whoever shall call upon this name will be saved. When our soul has departed this life to seek its eternal home, the Church asks in the name of Jesus, "Eternal rest give unto him, O Lord."








Classes resume on Monday, January 6, 2025 for grades 3 - 8 and Saturday, January 11, 2025, for grades 1 & 2.
